After the idea of opening a tropical butterfly house and insect museum popped into my head 20 years ago ...after starting the Missoula Butterfly House and Insectarium nearly 15 years ago to begin reaching toward this dream ...and after welcoming volunteers, supporters, and staff on the journey that's lead to today ...I'm excited to announce that this dream has become a reality. The Missoula Butterfly House and Insectarium is now open!

We've had an incredibly busy past few months since starting to move into our new home in mid-September. Planting the tropical plants. Finalizing and installing our exhibits and interpretive information. Doubling our staff over the past 4 months. Working the bugs out as we begin using a variety of new systems for admissions, volunteers, and more. And working the bugs in as we've welcomed an amazing array of new animals as the stars of our exhibits – including over 35 species of tropical butterflies.

Coming Full Circle

Let's take a trip down memory lane ...back to early 2010, when Mike Weissmann and Rachel Williams came to visit the Missoula Butterfly House and Insectarium. At that time, we were a new organization with a big vision, no offices or facility to visit, essentially no funds, and our menagerie of Bug Ambassadors used for our outreach programs were all housed in our Executive Director's home.

We had just raised enough funding to hire Mike (Kallima Consultants) to conduct a feasibility study to determine if our vision for a tropical butterfly house and insect museum in Missoula was possible. As part of their work, Mike and Rachel spent a few days with us in Missoula to learn more about our community and visit Missoula's existing museums to help with our assessment. In July of 2010 their study came back as a big "thumbs up", giving us the confidence to begin what turned into a 13 year journey.

We were fortunate to get to know both Mike and Rachel very well over the next 13 years, with Mike's promise that when our opening day arrived, he and Rachel would both be there to celebrate with us. Well ...they kept their promise!



Butterflies in da' house!

On November 8th, we held a small gathering to release our very first butterflies into our tropical butterfly house ...just in time for our first school field trips, which started a few days later. Since then we've introduced nearly 800 butterflies into our conservatory, representing about 35 different species from all over the world, including Ecuador, Colombia, Kenya, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Thailand, and several other countries.

Seeing these first butterflies take flight was truly a magical moment, representing the realization of our long-term dream. But just as exciting, this magic is now repeated on a daily basis as we release some of the 250 (or so) butterflies we receive each week. If you have not had the chance to visit us yet, these photos will give you an idea of what to expect.



Our Swarm is Growing!

Realizing our dream of opening a tropical butterfly house has required us to stretch our wings, expand our office space, and welcome a number of new faces. We've been incredibly lucky to find amazing individuals to fill our new staff positions, taking our crew of 7 to a swarm of 13 in just 4 months!
